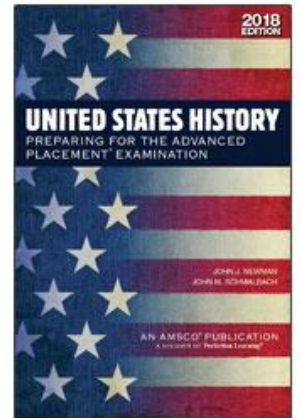


AP US History Summer Homework

Textbook: We will be using the AMSCO United States History review book as our main textbook next year. There are 3 methods for obtaining the reading for this summer:

1. Purchase your own. It is \$21.95 + shipping at this website: <https://www.perfectionlearning.com/social-studies/advanced-placement/united-states-history-ap-exam.html>. You may find it cheaper somewhere else (Right now it is \$4.69 on Thrift Books), but make sure it is an updated edition (2016 or newer).
2. Check out a copy from the library.
3. Go to my website and download a PDF version of the reading and questions. You will still need to get a copy of the book to use during the school year.

Summer Homework:

1. Read and Outline Chapter 1: A New World of Many Cultures, 1491-1607 (pages 2-13) – You will read chapter 1 and outline in a designated AP US History notebook (if you need one then ask Ms. Dickie in Room 207). You should have at least one sentence of information for each bolded section and term, but a good outline may include more. They do not have to be complete sentences. The outline must be handwritten.
 - You can see an example of Chapter 1 outlined on my website
 - If you bought the new 2021 or 2022 version of the book, then you are outlining pages 2-25 and 34-36 instead. These pages include more questions mixed into the reading. You do NOT have to answer these questions.
2. Watch the Unit Videos – In addition to the chapter outlines, I will provide videos for you to watch each unit. These will help provide quick summaries of main topics as well as provide a few questions for you to answer.

 - You will have to create an account. Make sure you use your real first and last name so I can give you credit
